1. Demographics (gender, medical school country, and birth year)
2. Training records (program ID, training outcome every six months, whether leave of absence)
 - Clinical Competence Committee reports for CA residents are available starting 2001A – at least three different forms from 2001A to the present, however, the following seven essential attributes have stayed similar with slight wording change.
 - 1a. Demonstrated ethical/moral behavior
 - 1b. Demonstrated high standards of ethical and moral behavior
 - 2a. Is reliable, conscientious, responsible and honest
 - 2b. Demonstrates honesty, integrity, reliability, and responsibility
 - 3. Learns from experience; knows limits
 - 4a. Reacts to stressful situations appropriately
 - 4b. Reacts to stressful situation in an appropriate manner)
 - 5. Has no documented abuse of alcohol or illegal use of drugs during this report period
 - 6a. Has no cognitive, physical, sensory or motor impairment that precludes individual responsibility for any aspect of anesthesiology care
 - 6b. Has no cognitive, physical, sensory or motor impairment that precludes acquiring and processing information in an independent and timely manner)
 - 7a. Demonstrates respect for the dignity of patients and colleagues
 - 7b. Demonstrates respect for the dignity of patients and colleagues, and sensitivity to a diverse patient population)

3. Exam data
 - Primary ITE scores
 - Other exams: Pass/fail prior to 2002; Pass/fail and scores since 2002
4. Certification data
 - Primary, subspecialty in critical care medicine, pain medicine, pediatric anesthesiology, hospice and palliative medicine, sleep medicine (e.g., non-time limited vs. time-limited; effective date and expiration date, if applicable; whether revoked)
